Caller ...saying that if we phone the local Borough Council then that they will provide food vouchers...

HCC You haven't phoned the local Borough Council, you've phoned Hampshire County Council.

Caller I know. I phoned them and they said they'd never heard of such a thing and they suggested I phone you, so that's what I'm doing.

CC Yes. Actually it's done through... I'm just having a look... it's called "Connect". I'm going to give you the web-site.

Caller OK.

HCC It's www.connecttosupporthampshire.org.uk. It'll explain what the Covid vouchers are. They're actually issued through the schools and childminders and pre-schools and places like that.

Caller I see. OK. So, that web-site will point me in the right direction, you are saying?

HCC You can't apply for them, it has to be the school. The schools, pre-schools and child-minders, they will apply for them for you.

Caller But it's the holidays, so the schools are closed.

HCC I know, I understand that, but at the moment, those vouchers, that's where they are going to and that's who's handing them out, not us I'm afraid. But if you go onto that site it will give you... if you're in hardship, places for emergency food... places like that...

Caller OK

HCC But at the moment that's the only advice I've got for you, that it's done through schools.

Caller Well thank you very much for your help. I must say I'm a little bit disappointed because, as I say, I've got an email from the Member of Parliament saying that all a family in hardship had to do was phone the Borough Council and they would receive food vouchers or food that day. And that seems not to have been true.

HCC No. I'm going to put you on hold. I'm going to speak to a colleague of mine, but I don't think that is the case. Just bear with me, OK?

Caller OK, thank you.

HCC [Music for several minutes.] ...Hello, sorry to keep you on hold.

Caller That's OK.

HCC Yes, that's what it is. What happens... it is to do with schools, they're the ones who have to issue it. So unfortunately you're going to have to wait until the school returns. But, that web-site I gave you, if you go into that it will take you to pages where you can get help and support if you need it now.

Caller OK, I will do that, thank you. But, just to be clear, the Council aren't providing food for families during the school holidays, then?

HCC Well, we are, but the vouchers have been given out to schools and pre-schools and childcarers. We give it out to them and it's them that need to apply for it.

Caller But during the school holidays, though, the school is closed, so there's no way of applying, is there?

HCC Well, no, but if you go on to that website that I gave you, that will give you ideas of where you can go and get help.

Caller OK, but it won't be from the Council, by the sound of it.

HCC I don't know, you'd need to go in and have a look. I'm just having a look for you... If you've children, once the schools return you can reach out to the school for support. But also, if you go into that web page it'll give you advice on where to go to get help. And also, your local council, you can speak to them about food banks and things like that...

Caller OK, all right.

HCC ... and the Citizens Advice Bureau is also another good place to go, who can help you.

Caller Right. Thanks very much for your help.
